## 2017/2018 Parish Council Tax

For the past six years, the Parish Council's annual charge on a Band 'D' property has remained largely unchanged at a yearly average of £88.52. Unfortunately an increase has been necessary for the forthcoming financial year ending 31 March 2018. The Council has set its 2017/2018 Precept at £563,000 which means that the estimated annual Parish Council charge on a Band 'D' property in Rustington will be £93.32 an annual increase of £3.28 (3.64%). This total Band 'D' charge equates to £1.79 per week, an increase of approximately 6p per week over last year. The final amount, which will be fixed by the Arun District Council as the tax collecting body, may differ slightly depending on that Council's registered number of single person properties (receiving a discount of 25%, plus an estimated 0.6% non-collection rate of Council Tax in Rustington).

The Council regrets the need for this increase but it, like everyone else, is prone to inflationary pressures and, exacerbated by Arun District Council's decision to withdraw the Localisation of Council Tax Support Grant, has not found it possible, despite certain cost efficiency savings,

to keep the Parish Precept at its current level. However, the Council will continue to strive to achieve ever improved efficiency and value for money in its operation, whilst doing its best to maintain the local services that are so appreciated by residents and visitors alike.

These services include the maintenance and daily operation of The Woodlands Centre, the Woodlands Recreation Ground; the Rustington Youth Centre; the Woodland Park Sportsfield; the Village Information Centre; the Museum; over 150 Allotment Plots; Bus and Beach Shelters; Public Seats; the War Memorial; four Public Toilet Units; a School Crossing Patrol; some Street Lighting; the continued enhancement and maintenance of all floral and planted displays throughout the Village; Christmas Lighting and Grants to local Organisations. A contribution will again be made to the No. 12 Bus Service.

In addition, other work planned for 2017/2018 includes the further development of new uses for the delightful building, now known as The Garden Room, at the rear of the Museum, new directional signage for the Village and further

improvements at The Woodlands Centre.

I believe that the Council continues to provide excellent 'value for money' for its parishioners and, at the same time, works in close partnership with the local Community to ensure that Rustington maintains its reputation as a most vibrant and pleasant place to live.

Local residents, as always, will have an opportunity to find out much more about how the Council has spent its Precept during the past year, and how it plans to spend its Precept during the next financial year at the Annual Assembly of the Parish Meeting which will be held on Thursday 20 April 2017 in the Village Memorial Hall at 7.30 pm.

I would also like to take this opportunity of reminding parishioners that Meetings of the Council's Committees, including the Finance and General Purposes, are open to the public and further details such as dates, timing, etc., can be obtained from the Council Offices.

### Parishoner's Award

As in previous years, the Council is, once again, inviting all members of the community to submit nominations for the 2017 Parishioners' Awards.

Two awards can be made each year - one to an Individual and one to a Group/
Organisation - in recognition of outstanding Public Service to the Community. All Rustington parishioners or parish-based organisations (including voluntary groups and professionals) are eligible to receive these Awards

Individuals, Groups and Organisations from outside of the Parish, who make an outstanding contribution for the benefit of the community of Rustington, may also be considered for these Awards.

Nomination Forms are available from the Council's Offices and the Village Information Centre. The closing date for the receipt of nominations is **24 April** and the winners will be announced in June.

## **Rustington-In-Bloom**

The Committee had its regular stall at the Christmas Shopping Event on 3 December and I would like to thank the local community and visitors for their support, also all the local traders and businesses for their donations to the Event. We raised a magnificent £1,063.00 which will be used towards this year's In-Bloom Campaign including the further development of the Wildlife Garden on the Woodlands Recreation Ground.



On **Saturday 18 March** in The Garden Room, in the Community Garden at the rear of the Museum, there is another fund raising Event, a Coffee and Cake Morning with Tombola and Bric-a-Brac from 10.00 am to 1.00 pm. Please drop in, you will all be most welcome.

There will be other Events such as the well-established Plant Sale which is yet to be confirmed. Please look out for further information.



The Youth Club is a venue for young people aged between 11 - 17 years old. Open every Thursday evening during term time, it offers a variety of activities including pool, table tennis, air hockey, video games consoles, sports, art and more. Each week there is also a tuck shop and an ongoing programme including cooking, movie nights, inflatables, theme nights, and sports. The programme is fun, varied, and designed with young people involved in the planning and ideas.

The Club has has a great team of staff and volunteers committed to seeing young people included and supported. The whole team is committed to making a difference to the lives of young people and are able to assess the needs of young people in order to plan and deliver programmes related to areas such as health, fitness, smoking, drugs, relationships and bullying.
